

Scenes from “Taming the Wild, Wild West in a Dress” June 25, 26, 28, 29, 2011

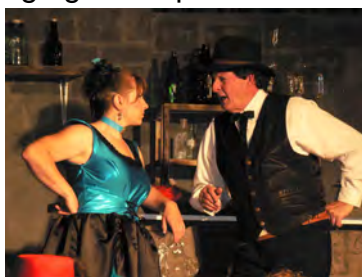
